- Students are required to maintain FULL TIME status throughout the school year (min. 3 courses/semester). Grade 9 and 10 students must choose 8 courses for school year (4 courses/semester) - spare periods not permitted until grade 11.
- Make sure to research and choose your courses/academic levels carefully. Course changes at the start of each semester may not be possible. You should speak with your guidance counsellor, parents and teachers when making course selections and developing your pathways plan.

# COURSE SELECTION INFORMATION & RESOURCES

## PATHWAYS PLANNING TIPS

Make careful choices when determining course levels as these may impact post-secondary options:

- Applied (gr. 9/10) & college (gr. 11/12) level typically for college/diploma pathway.
- Academic (gr. 9/10) & university (gr. 11/12) level courses for university/degree pathway.
- Research potential destinations/requirements for programs (including grade 12 courses).
- Make course selections VERY carefully. As SJAM is a growing school, we have many full classes and making changes to courses after the start of a new semester can be extremely difficult.
- Work backwards from grade 12 requirements to ensure you have prerequisites and that you're on track for post-secondary options (including courses/admission averages).

## MYWAY COURSE SELECTIONS

- At the start of second semester, students will use the MyWay site to select their courses for the following school year.
- Visit [MYWAY.WRDSB.CA](http://MYWAY.WRDSB.CA) or use the link on the SJAM homepage ([JAM.WRDSB.CA](http://JAM.WRDSB.CA)).
- Use your school account username and password.
- Click on COURSE REQUESTS. Select student destination (should be "I will be returning to this School Board" if you are returning to SJAM next year).
- Make sure to select the appropriate grade level for your courses. Select your courses from the drop-down menu (recommend entering compulsory courses first). After each selection, click ADD COURSE (will see it appear in list below).
- After entering all your courses (compulsory and elective), you are strongly recommended to select 2 alternate courses. These are used as replacements should course choices get cancelled or conflict with other classes once timetabling starts. Make sure these are classes you would be willing to take next year!
- Once you've completed all your selections, click PRINT FRIENDLY VERSION. On the next screen, print out 2 copies of your selections. One copy must be signed and handed in to guidance on course selection collection day. Keep the other copy for your records.
- HELPFUL TIP—please provide any relevant course request information on your printed course selections (such as planned summer school courses, separating certain classes, etc). This information is helpful when your guidance counsellor is finalizing your timetable. Students should not use this printout to request specific teachers or to map out your entire timetable.
- Students will have a limited window of time to make changes to course requests before timetabling begins.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS AT SJAM

### ADVANCED PLACEMENT (Pre-AP)

The Pre-AP and AP courses are a powerful opportunity to help students acquire the knowledge, concepts, and skills needed to engage in a higher level of learning.

Pre-AP/AP extends the current curriculum and enriches specific learning outcomes. Enrolling in Pre-AP courses prepares students for success in senior Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Evaluation is based on the regular academic/university level Ontario curriculum.

Students wishing to take Pre-AP/AP courses need to select the regular Academic/University level course in My Way and complete an online application (available on the SJAM website). Students will then have their academic history reviewed for approval by the Selection Committee for each Pre-AP/AP course selected and students will be placed in the appropriate courses following this process.

The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) program allows students to explore their interest in one of three areas through expanded course offerings and experiences:

- **INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY**

SHSM's are recognized by universities and colleges throughout Ontario. Students choose a set of grade 11 & 12 courses, earn certifications and specialized training, and take part in experiential learning activities specific to each specialist program. This also includes Co-op and other career-related experiences in specialist areas which will assist students with post-secondary and career planning.
